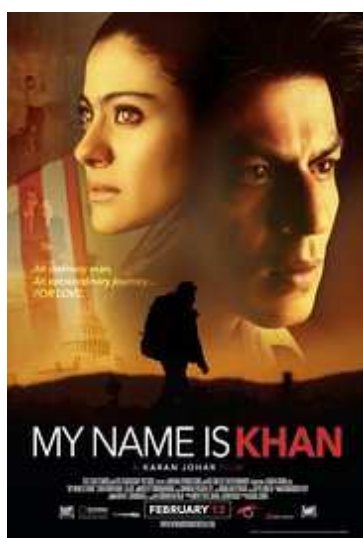

Rizwan Khan, a Muslim from Mumbai, suffers from Asperger's Syndrome, a form of high-functioning autism that complicates socialisation. Rizwan marries a Hindu single mother, Mandira, in San Francisco. After 9/11, Rizwan is detained by authorities at LAX who mistake his disability for suspicious behaviour. Following his arrest, he meets Radha, a therapist who helps him deal with his situation and his affliction. Rizwan then begins a journey to meet US President Bush to clear his name.
